Here are a Few Things to Know:

- Activities for KidsFest Adventure are geared toward young children (ages birth-five), though participation by all ages is welcomed.
- Participation in KidsFest Adventure activities is FREE. However, there may be an admission fee required for some locations. If an admission fee is required, it will be noted under that activity in this guide.
- Not every activity in this guide occurs every day (May 7-17). Please check dates/times for the activities in which you plan to participate.
- Activities listed (particularly those providing materials) are available on a first come, first served basis, while supplies last.

Make Easy Homemade Play Dough

May 7-17– Check out the recipe below to make your own play dough at home! This play dough is easy to make, typically lasts longer than store-bought options, is extremely soft, and is made of all edible ingredients (just in case it is ingested).

Homemade Play Dough Recipe **Ingredients:** 1. Mix flour, salt, and cream of tartar in a bowl. 2. Add water and vegetable oil to mixture. Mix well. 1 cup Flour Add food coloring. ½ Cup of Salt 4. Pour into pan and heat over medium-low heat. 2 tsp. Cream of Tartar 5. Stir mixture until the dough forms a ball. 1 cup Water 6. Remove pan from heat and pour ball onto cutting board. Knead dough until smooth. Be careful; it's hot! 1 TBS Vegetable Oil Once it cools, you're ready to PLAY! **Food Coloring** *Playdough can be stored in plastic container for several weeks.
